Chairs Report led by Stephen Thomas

- Proxy voting conflict - constitution of St. Greg's was changed years ago to allow proxy voting while board's constitution does not allow it. We changed the constitution last year (2016-17 council) back to align with the board - now members are asking to change back to allow the proxy voting. More research has to be done and if there is an amendment to be done it needs to be announced 45 days prior to the AGM and voted on and changed then. Current executive council remains in favor of not allowing proxy votes - hence keeping constitution as is and in line with the board
- Sewing Club Proposal and Artist in the Class proposals will be voted on this Friday, June 15th. Budget as was for \$2000 for 10 sewing machines for the sewing club and \$8200 to be designated to Flint Designs for one artist in the
